

## TRIBUTORIES OF THE STOUR - ANSWERS

- 1 Rises on Cambridgeshire border, near a place that means 'place in the reeds'  
joins the Stour near Wixoe  
**Bumpsted Brook**
- 2 7 miles long, all in Essex, rises near little Yeldham,  
joins the Stour at Brundon  
**Belchamp Brook**
- 3 3 miles long, rises near Pebmarsh, joins the Stour just by Bures Mill  
**Cambridge Brook**
- 4 Rises about 6 miles short of Bury St Edmunds, passes through Boxted  
(the Suffolk one) joins the Stour above Melford **River Glem**
- 5 Rises very close to No 4 and joins the Stour between No 4 and Melford  
**Chad Brook**
- 6 11 miles long, little more than a ditch, passes Edwardstone  
joins the Stour at Langham  
**The Box**
- 7 22 miles long, second main part rises near Lavenham, passes Chelsworth  
joins the Stour at Higham  
**River Brett**
- 8 Last tributary on the Stour, 7 miles long and joins the Stour near Parkston  
**Ramsey Brook**
- 9 A tiny tributary only 1 mile long, joins the Stour near Great Bradley, shares  
its name with the outfall from the Ely-Ouse scheme  
**Kirtling Brook**
- 10 Rises close to the official source it winds through Cambridgeshire and  
Suffolk for 7 miles before joining the Stour - some say it's the true source  
**Stour Brook**
